## Commonly Confused Words: Envelope vs. Envelop

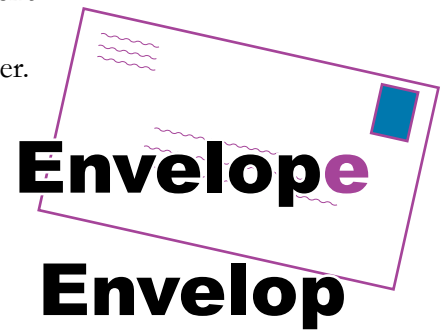
*Envelope* and *envelop* sound a little alike. Their meanings are related but different.

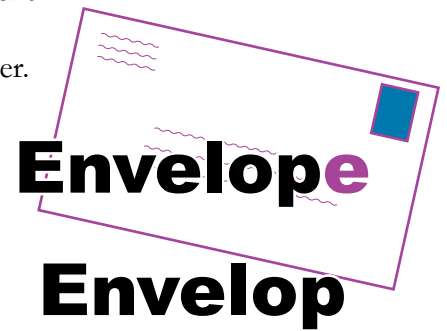
